ALFRISTON KAHUI AKO AC ACHIEVEMENT CHALLENGE We aim to ensure 85% of Alfriston Kāhui Ako school leavers will achieve a NCEA Level 2 or higher qualification that will support them in their continued pathway.	 Overall achievement is up at NCEA L1, 2 and 3 compared to 2016; The improvements at all three levels are larger for boys than for girls, which puts boys' achievement higher than girls' – bucking a national trend and previous years' data for AC; The biggest improvements at L1 were for Maori and Pasifika learners – both up by 11 percentage points from 2016; L1 Lit and Num achievement remain very similar to 2016 for Year 11 learners – a slight improvement in L1 Lit and a slight fall in Num. However, both figures are above the average for D1-3 schools;
