Special SCHOOL LEADER'S REPORT: 2-20 March 2020

Because of COVID-19 and the government's response, the school finished early at 3pm on Monday 23 March. This was to allow staff to meet to ensure there was consistent messaging on Covid-19 during the next two days of Meet The Amokura meetings (on Tuesday 24 March and Wednesday 25 March). The meeting would also enable preliminary discussion on our response to the possibility of school closing and on-line learning taking over.

At 2pm that day the PM announced that all learners would stay at home as the country prepared to go into lock down; according to the government's Covid-19 Alert levels, the country moved to Alert Level 3 immediately after her announcement. The planned MTA meetings were subsequently cancelled. This also meant only teachers who were not part of the high-risk category would come into school over the following two days to prepare for delivery of on-line learning. Staff who could not come into school because of Covid-19 restrictions would 'work from home'. At midnight Wednesday 25 March, the country moved to Alert Level 4. From Thursday 26 March, the country went into total lockdown and self-isolation for all, excluding essential workers and services.

Access to school is restricted to all until the end of the lockdown period. The Term 1 holidays will begin early, from 30 March. Term 2 will begin on Wednesday 15 April, but everybody will be working and learning from home. Should the lock down period end as currently planned, the school site will reopen on 28 April.

Our learning from home provision is through google applications. All learners can access current learning and assessment through our google platform. New learning and virtual classrooms will begin on Wednesday 15 April. It is expected that all teachers will run virtual classrooms using google classroom as they are currently timetabled. They will also use other applications as they see appropriate and relevant.

Many learners left before the lock down with printed material if they did not have adequate access to the internet. During the lock down period, learners without access to on-line learning will be provided with printed lessons / activities. The MOE will be leading and delivering this as access to our school site is strictly restricted.

The MOE has been very supportive and have provided excellent leadership to ensure schools are doing the best they can for their staff and learners.
